EMULSION

This call for entry is open to all residents of the Washington-Baltimore combined statistical metropolitan area as defined by the US Census (see full description of eligibility below). This is an opportunity for artists from the central Mid-Atlantic to showcase the extraordinary diversity in regional contemporary art.

An emulsion combines two seemingly incompatible ingredients to produce a third yet entirely new substance. In this spirit, East City Art's EMULSION seeks to combine the culturally different yet geographically close regions of Washington and Baltimore and to combine a wide array of art forms and mediums from two-dimensional work to performance based pieces.

East City Art envisions EMULSION as an annual event that will exhibit the brightest talent from the Mid-Atlantic region. We expect EMULSION to grow over time to include more entries, an increase in prize money and visibility beyond the Mid-Atlantic to the national and international level.

Advertising and Publicity

EMULSION will be a highly publicized event with a generous advertising budget to ensure both a large audience and high visibility for selected artists. In addition, East City Art will publicize the event through its widely read online presence. In September 2013, East City Art will be available in print as a quarterly arts guide with an estimated 65,000 reader through a partnership with Capitol Community News.

About Juror Lauren Gentile

Lauren Gentile, founder of Contemporary Wing, has produced major exhibitions of historically significant artists including the 30 Americans artists, Shepard Fairey, the Guerrilla Girls, and JR, among others. While supporting the artists of today, she has helped nurture such emerging talent as GAIA, Hedieh Javanshir Ilchi, and Cheryl Pope. She holds an M.A. in art business from Sotheby's Institute London and B.A. degrees in art theory and criticism, art history and international studies from the School of the Art Institute in Chicago, DePaul University, the University of Florence and the Goethe Institute. Her private sector career includes work with art hedge funds and as director of sales in auction houses and galleries specializing in a variety of markets.

- All applications must be postmarked by Monday September 9, 2013.
- No e-mail or hand delivered entries will be accepted

Work to be Considered

All work will be considered including but not limited to two dimensional work (painting, photography, digital imaging, drawing)), three dimensional work (sculpture), performance art and new media. Note that Gallery O on H has a very large outdoor patio-courtyard area including large adjacent brick walls all of which can easily accommodate outdoor sculptures and installation pieces.

What to Send

- Up to three images of work that you propose showing either in print or on a CD or Jump Drive that is both MAC and PC viewable. If we cannot see the images, the application will be considered incomplete.
- Up to three segments of audio/video that you propose showing, each no longer three minutes in duration on a CD or Jump Drive note all files must be both MAC and PC viewable
- An artist biography, CV or resume (in print)
- An artist statement (in print)
- Contact information including phone number and email (on CV or resume is acceptable)
- A list of the works submitted with titles, media, and dimensions (in print)
- NOTE- materials will NOT be returned, including jump drives
- A check or money order for \$35 made out to East City Art Media LLC

Delivery and Pick-up

- Artists are responsible for transporting work to and from the gallery and delivering work during scheduled acceptance times and dates.
- Art works that differ significantly from the images submitted for judging, or are not ready for gallery installation, will be rejected.
- We will not receive shipped work.
- All work accepted for exhibition will remain for the duration of the exhibition.

Installation

- Two dimensional work must be ready to hang and appropriately presented
- All two dimensional work will be installed and dismantled by East City Art and Gallery O on H staff
- Three dimensional work that requires special assistance, plinths, stands or other devices to display work will be installed by artist.
- Any work that requires projection monitors or other non-traditional two dimensional hanging systems will be installed by artist upon delivery.

Insurance/Commission

Gallery O on H will retain a 35% commission on all artworks sold during, or as a result of the exhibition. Artists are responsible for insuring all consigned artwork while in the custody of the gallery from the time they are received by delivery, until the pick-up date. Gallery O on H does not possess consignment insurance and cannot be responsible for damaged, lost or stolen works. We suggest you carry insurance on your work or self insure.

About East City Art

Phil Hutinet began East City Art on January 4, 2010 to document and promote the growing emerging visual arts movement in eastern Washington, DC. The online visual arts journal covers the following areas:

- The neighborhoods of Anacostia, Brookland, Capitol Hill, Deanwood, Ekington, H Street NE, NoMa and Trinidad in DC
- The towns of the Gateway Arts District in Maryland including Brentwood, North Brentwood, Hyattsville and Mount Rainier

Since 2009, the eastern neighborhoods of Washington, DC have become the center of contemporary emerging art in the Washington DC metropolitan area.

East City Art posts press releases about events, openings, calls for entry and coursework on a daily basis. The publication has a dedicated staff of paid writers who interview local artists, lead community discussions and review local exhibitions.

East City Art's mission is to connect local artists with the community at large by creating a dialog between the artist and members of the community. As a community-based publication, East City Art highlights the irrefutable link between economic development and the arts, drawing attention to the

About Gallery O on H

Gallery OonH is a unique indoor-outdoor culture and community space where art, music and the unexpected come together to deliver a fresh approach to retail experience.

The vision for Gallery OonH is actually to be seen as several spaces connected as one. The aim is to be an intersection of culture and fun and will use it as the vehicle to develop the retail space as an artistic and cultural destination.

What started out initially as a plan for a traditional "white cube" gallery exhibiting both self-taught folk art and a variety of local dc artists has grown into something much bigger and much more relevant to a growing a neighborhood community. Our goal is to provide the entire community easy access to unexpected and unique artistic programming and presentations.

... and what's with the name "Gallery OonH"?

Well, it is three-fold. First we promote OUR OWN DC artists in a setting that is both friendly and inviting. Lastly, the "O" stands for OTTO, the principal owner of the gallery who believed in his dream that, in order to make a community stronger, art and music need to be a visible, viable component of the streetscape.
